About The Village of Southern Victoria

The lovely Village of Southern Victoria is located on the St. John River, 40km south of Grand Falls near the mouth of the Tobique River. Perth, on the east side of the river, and Andover on the west, were amalgamated into one village in 1966 and have a population service area of more than 6000 people. In 2022, Perth-Andover, Aroostook and the surrounding areas were joined to form the Village of Southern Victoria.

Nestled between the rolling hills of the upper river valley, this picturesque village is often referred to as the “Gateway to the Tobique.” Ten kilometers to the west of the municipality is the US border and to the south approximately 80km is Woodstock and the entrance to the Interstate 95 leading to the New England states.

Residents of Southern Victoria enjoy many activities and attractions from shopping and culture to recreational activities, festivals, and concerts.

The Village takes pride in its scenic views and rich quality of life. Business owners in the community will testify to the advantages of doing business in The Village of Southern Victoria.

Advantages include low property taxes, a newly expanded industrial park, low-cost power, and an available work force. New businesses can locate near the newly developed four-lane Trans-Canada Highway.

The Village of Southern Victoria has a semi-continental climate with a warm summer and frosty winter. Snow depths of 1+ cm approximately 100 days each year, making this the ideal spot for winter sports such as skiing, snow shoeing and snowmobiling

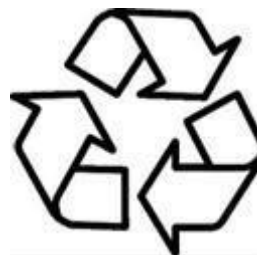

Tourism

The Village of Southern Victoria operates the Tourism Information Centre, which is located at the Waterfront Adventure Centre along the banks of the St John River at 1150 West Riverside Drive. Great Attractions within 30 minutes

Grand Falls, NB:

Spend the afternoon hiking the trails along the Grand Falls Gorge and watch in wonder as the water gushes through the gates of the Grand Falls. If you are up for an adventure, try zip-lining across the falls with ZipZag. Shopping is also available at many local or chain retailers. The Grand Falls shopping district offers a variety of options from

hardware to drugstores and an assortment of trendy clothing stores.

Visit the District of Tobique Valley which plays host to great events such as the Fiddlers on the Tobique (June), the Plaster Rock Summer Festival (July-August), and the World Pond Hockey Championships (February). Social Insurance

A social insurance number (SIN) is a nine-digit identification number given to you for the purposes of income tax, child tax benefit, employment insurance, old age pension, or other government programs. You must have a social insurance number to work in Canada. To apply, visit Human Resource Development Canada office. An application form must be filled out and original (not photocopied) passports and/or immigration documents must be presented.



Currency

The national currency is the Canadian Dollar. Banknotes come in denominations of \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 and all have their own distinct colors and graphics. Coins include the five cent (a nickel), 10 cent (a dime), 25 cent (quarter), one dollar (a loonie), and the two dollar (a toonie).

Financial Institutions

There are two banking institutions in the Village of Southern Victoria, Bank of Montreal, and Scotiabank, offering services like savings and chequing accounts, debit and credit cards, mortgages, investments, and personal loans, etc.

Driving

Every person who wishes to drive must have a valid driver's license which must be always carried on them while driving a vehicle. Income Tax

When working for an employer, a percentage of your pay cheque will be deducted and sent to the federal government to pay your owing income tax. This money is used to pay for government services. For more information, please visit the Canadian Revenue agencies website: www.cra-arc.gc.ca

Canada Pension Plan

A small percentage of your pay cheque is allocated to this plan. When you retire, you will receive a monthly payment from the federal government. To find out more, visit the Employment and Social Development Canada website: Employment and Social Development Canada - Canada.ca

Employment Insurance

A percentage of your pay cheque will be deducted every month and deposited into an Employment Insurance account. Employers also contribute into this account. This service provides funds, (if eligible) for a short period of time while you are looking for a new job or undertaking training to learn new skills. Taxes

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) is a tax that applies to most goods and services in Canada. The Atlantic Provinces (excluding PEI) harmonized their sales tax with the GST to create the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) of 15%. For more information see: GST/HST - Canada.ca

Politics

Municipal Government

Southern Victoria's municipal government is governed by an elected mayor and council. Elections of these members are held by secret ballot every 4 years. It is important to exercise your right to vote. To ensure your name is added to the voters list, [contact Elections NB](#).

Alcohol, Tobacco, and Drugs

In New Brunswick the law states that:

- You must be 19 years of age to purchase, consume, or possess alcohol, cigarettes or [cannabis](#).
- Drinking alcohol and/or smoking cannabis, and driving is illegal.
